On International Women's Day, March 8, 2022, bankers from across Texas visited with policymakers on Capitol Hill to make their voice heard in support of the banking industry during the ABA Washington Summit. Three Financial Women in Texas were a part of the Texas Bankers Association delegation: Hazel Davis, Jessica Lovell, and T.D. Winters.

Jessica Lovell, a graduate of TBA's Management Development Program (MDP) attended as part of Class XIII. According to Jessica, "Being at the Capitol on International Women's Day, advocating for the banking industry, was an incredible experience. I felt powerful and confident, although I may not have understood every aspect of each legislation. My improved confidence is attributed to prior leadership training, MDP, as well as Financial Women In Texas."

T.D. Winters chose to attend as a way to get out of her comfort zone, and to be able to see and hear from congressional leaders and other bankers across the country. "The topics we all focus on within our organizations are important, but a bigger picture experience helps open our eyes and minds" T.D. added.

Hazel Davis, a first time attendee agreed, "It was a great opportunity to meet and learn from other bankers, and to hear policymaker opinions on our industry". As a first time attendee Hazel was eligible for a \$1,000 stipend from the Texas Bankers Association. Hazel was thankful for the experience, and said, "The ABA Emerging Leaders Forum was excellent and the stipend was a factor in my decision to attend."

These women were able to be a voice for women in the industry. T.D also shared that, "Being part of an organization like FWIT, we strengthen and encourage each other to speak up. Men are often the "head" of organizations, but the head can't turn without a neck. Women are the neck and backbone that support our positions."


